St. Bridgit's Crosses, Imbolc and Holy Wells at Our February Meeting

February 1st is St. Bridgit's Feast Day, usually commemorated with the making of St. Bridgit's Crosses, those rushwoven symbols integral to the legend of Bridgit's encounter with a dying Roman general. Using materials that she found next to the stream where he lay, she fashioned a cross from rushes, giving it to the Roman who she converted to Christianity at his last breath. In the Druidic calendar this time of year, February 1-2, is known as Imbolc. It celebrates the renewal of life after Samhain has done his dance of death. Now flowers bloom again and nature begins to light the morning and night skies. The daffodils are awash in Ireland and trees begin to bud in Portland.





At our February meeting Louise Martell will have materials for fashioning St. Bridgit's crosses. At this time of year Holy Wells are visited by both Christian and Druidic followers. There are said to be 3,000 Holy Wells in Ireland. They are usually of limited, local size and are often said to have been derived thought the power of a Saint. Some attribute magical healing powers to the waters of the wells. Is there any truth to that? Truth is usually what you chose to believe, but come to our February meeting and find out. 
