Following the **April 22, 2017** Annual meeting, Louise Martell led an “Irish Trivia game” that was a lot of fun. She had some challenging trivia and small trinkets for the winners. Julie O’Connell led the Book Club discussion of *The Lion of Ireland* by Morgan Llywelyn, a fictional history of Brian Boru.

Appreciation Dinner on **May 21, 2017** at the Old Spaghetti Factory was chaired by Debbie Timmins. It was another great event with terrific food and good friends.

The Annual picnic was held on Sunday, **August 27, 2017**, at St. Birgitta’s Church Grove in Linton, chaired by Patrick Seed. There were games, music, dancing, and a good time was had by all who attended.

**September 16, 2017.** After the business meeting, Rose Ann Ranft gave a presentation about Irish symbols.

**October 14, 2017.** A crew made up of JJ and Helen Grealish, Tom Crowley, Brendan Kerg, Mary Rose Kerg, and Rose Ann Ranft cleaned, organized, and inventoried our supplies at the shed at St. Birgitta’s Parish.

**October 21, 2017.** The program after the regular meeting was by Lynn Duddy and Lawrence Howard from Portland Story Theater. Louise Martell was this year’s recipient, and she then gave us a wonderful presentation about Irish writers and the women who influenced them.

**December 2, 2017.** The Annual Christmas luncheon was held in the Wahkeena Room of the Holiday Inn at the Airport from 12:30 pm to 2:30 pm. The event was chaired by Rose Ann Ranft and Mary Sacksteder. There were gifts, carols, and a lovely meal.

**January 20, 2018.** The annual high tea, chaired by Caroline Fogarty and Julie O'Connell featured the usual delicious teas, sandwiches and sweets. The tea began at 6:00 pm, followed by a presentation by Don Anderson on his book, *Paper and Spit*, and his journey to find his biological family using DNA testing. We concluded the evening with the general business meeting.

**February 17, 2018.** Following the business meeting and social time, Tim Birr gave an excellent presentation on Saint Patrick – comparing the myths to what we can document historically. We also drew names for the Shamrock Cruise raffle held to benefit the St. Birgitta's Parish (as a gift to thank them for our storage space). Winners were Bill Berry (cruise), Dawn Redman (AICS membership), Tom and Peggy Scheideman (pot o'gold cash and chocolates), Molly McGuire (bread basket), and Tim Birr (wine).

A social and successful 77<sup>th</sup> Annual St. Patrick's Day Celebration was held on **March 17, 2018** at Aquinas Hall, 340 NE Clackamas Street in Portland. Doors opened at 3:00 pm followed by continuous entertainment until 8:00 pm. AICS members now sign up for volunteer shifts online through SignUp.com, thanks to Brendan Kerg.

- Margaret Doherty read the Proclamation signed by Oregon Governor Kate Brown.
- Don Anderson and the Concords sang the National Anthems and also led a sing-a-long.
- Tualatin Valley Pipe and Drums were fabulous, as always.
- The marvelous Molly Malone and Yeates Academy Dancers were first up with Irish step dances.
- The group Bidy on the Bench charmed us with music and song.
- The Grand Finale was the Oregon Irish Dance Academy dancers.
- The children were entertained with a 50-minute puppet show by Penny's Puppets as well as face painting, coloring, story time and games.
- The raffle included "gold" (\$5 tickets) items and "green" (\$1 each, 6 for \$5) for items donated by local businesses and AICS members.
- Wine (2 cases) was donated by Owen Roe Winery. O'Hara's beer (9 cases) was donated from Paulaner USA. Guinness and Harp were also available and all alcoholic beverages were \$5.
- Meals were catered by DeAngelo's and were bangers and mash (\$13), hot corned beef sandwiches (\$9.50), banger on a bun with chips (\$9), and cold sandwiches (\$8.50). Bob's Red Mill donated Irish soda bread which was served with the bangers and mash. All hot meals were sold out by 6:00 pm.

- The Irish soda bread was sold in whole loaves (\$5) and slices (\$1). Cookies, chips, pop and water were also available; tea and coffee were complimentary.
- General Admission was \$12 for adults and \$4 for minors (3-18).
