

Noted Poet and translator Carlos Reyes' book about Ireland, At the Edge of the Western Wave was a three time finalist for the prestigious National Poetry Series. A Choice from Two Pockets is his seventeenth published volume. Recent poetry: The Empty Chairs of February (2024), The Four Hinges of the World (2023), Osage Elegy (2021). His work as a translator is seen in Poemas de amor y locura/Poems of Love and Madness; Selected translations (2013). He is also the author of a prose memoir, The Keys to the Cottage, Stories from the West of Ireland (2015), finished while he was poet-in-residence at the Heinrich Boll Cottage on Achill Island, Ireland. On the Irish theme notable also: Along the Flaggy Shore, Poems from West Clare (2018).


